This hybrid Northern Shoveler x Cinnamon Teal was found and photographed by Brian Nicholas on 04 January 2020


Hybrids among waterfowl are rare, but more regular than in many other groups of birds. This combination has been recorded many times, including <u>this bird</u> from Phoenix and <u>this one</u> from Willcox..

This bird appears similar to Northern Shoveler in many ways, but with the rich chestnut coloration of the underparts of a Cinnamon Teal.
